

HIC Volunteer Medical Interpreter Dispatch Service





- "I feel in bad condition and I'd like to be seen at a hospital, but I don't understand Japanese."
- "I'd like someone to interpret for me while I am seeing a doctor at hospital but I don't know who to ask."

The Hiroshima International Center (HIC) will begin a Volunteer Medical Interpreter Dispatch Service <u>from November 27, 2018</u> for foreign people living in the Prefecture who because they have not acquired adequate Japanese language skills have difficulty when visiting a hospital for consultation and examinations, etc.



Using the service

①Who can use it?

➡• People of foreign nationals living in Hiroshima who feel insecure using the Japanese language.

2 Does it cost anything?

Until March 31, 2019, HIC will cover the full cost of volunteer medical interpreters.

③What languages can be interpreted?

- English / Chinese / Vietnamese / Tagalog / Spanish
- What hospitals can the service be used at?
 - Only hospitals which have presented application forms for the use of the Volunteer Medical Interpreter Service to HIC can be used. The service cannot be used at other hospitals.
 - Until March 31, 2019, only hospitals in Hiroshima City can be used.

5 How can I use the service?

- Please enquire at the reception desk or with the doctor of the hospital you are receiving consultation or treatment. Later, if the hospital decides that the Volunteer Medical Interpreter Dispatch Service is required, it will make a request to HIC for the service.
 - People outside the hospital cannot make a request to HIC for the service.

6 Is it certain an interpreter will be dispatched if requested?

Because of volunteers' circumstances, a volunteer interpreter may not be available.

The what situations is interpreting available?

Explaining reception desk procedures / consultation (examinations) tests / paying bills. Also, how to take prescribed medication and interpreting for all hospital, etc. needs.

What kind of people are volunteer medical interpreters?

Those who have received medical interpreting training and interpret accurately. They protect one's privacy. They cannot do interpreting other than that requested by the hospital.
